A primary source is a source of evidence that was created at the time for example, books written at the time, artefacts, art work at the time.

A secondary source is a source which is created after the time e.g. history books written after the time, photographs after the time, TV shows after the time.

When historians look at a primary or secondary source they need to decide whether it is good to use or not. They do that by looking at 3 things. . .

Relevant - is it about what you are studying?

Reliable - can you trust it?

Rich - has it got lots of information?
